"In every thing give thanks: for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus concerning you." (1 Thessalonians 5:18, KJV)

From childhood on, we are taught to pray, thanking God for our blessings:

"God is great, God is good. Let us thank Him for our food. By His hands, we are fed. Thank you Lord, for our daily bread."

Nonetheless, we are so often distracted by the busyness of life that we neglect to follow Paul's Spirit-inspired command to the Thessalonians: "In every thing give thanks...!" However, when we do remember to give thanks to God, we usually have no trouble recognizing blessings for which we should be thankful. So we begin to list our countless blessings in a litany of thanks to God—food, shelter, clothing, finances, good health, family, friends, etc. But how often do we stop to thank God for adverse situations—for hardships—for difficulties and trials?

Some people will say, "Remember—Paul tells us to give thanks IN every thing, not FOR every thing!" But, for the

record, the Apostle Paul also wrote to the Ephesians (5: 18, 20) the following instructions: "...be filled with the Spirit...always giving thanks FOR all things in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ to God!"

It's easy to thank God for blessings, but how often do we thank Him for hardships?
Vicki Huffman once wrote in the "Monroe (County) Journal" that

Matthew Henry knew how to thank God even for things he would not have chosen for himself. On the night he (Henry) was robbed, he prayed, 'I thank Thee first because I was never robbed before; second, because although they took my purse, they did not take my life; third, although they took my all, it was not much; and fourth, because it was I who was robbed and not I who robbed.

Reformer Martin Luther once said, "Frogs need storks!" In other words, we need trials—as well as pleasant experiences—in our lives. Hardship builds both faith and character. In

writing to the church in Rome, Paul says "We rejoice in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces endurance (perseverance), and endurance produces character, and character produces hope, and hope does not disappoint us, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit which has been given to us." (Romans 5:3-5, RSV)

During this month traditionally known for Thanksgiving, let me challenge you in a different way. Begin each new day with prayer, not only by saying "Thank you God FOR...", but also by praying "Thank you God, in spite of...!"

Angel Tree

Angel Tree is a program of Prison Fellowship that serves incarcerated parents by providing a pathway for strengthening and restoring their relationships with their children and families. Angel Tree is a unique program that gives Epworth an opportunity to share Christ's love with families of prisoners. The program connects parents in prison with their children through the delivery of Christmas gifts given on the parent's behalf.

When a mother or father is in prison, the pain of separation from their child can be acute, but an Angel Tree gift, delivered in the parent's name, can help restore and strengthen the relationship and act as a symbol of God's love. Epworth has been participating in the Angel Tree Program for over twenty years. Many children, their families and prisoner parent have been blessed by this program.

Epworth will be participating with the Angel Tree program again this year. We will not be asking you to sponsor a specific child, buy and wrap presents and deliver to the church. Several options were given from Prison Fellowship Ministries and it has been decided that we will provide gift cards to each child. We are asking for donations so that we can provide a \$25.00 gift card to each child on behalf of their incarcerated parent. We feel this is the safest way to be able to carry on this worthwhile program.

You have always been a very generous and loving church and I look forward to us being a part of Angel Tree again this year and praying for those we serve.

WREATHS ACROSS AMERICA – 2022

Wreaths Across America Day, which is Saturday, December 17, 2022, is approaching fast.

As you know, Wreaths Across America Day is the day we honor both our living and fallen Veterans by sponsoring wreaths thru WAA and placing them on the gravesites of Veterans interred at Fort Mitchell National Cemetery, Fort Benning Cemetery, and other local cemeteries.

We'll work primarily again this year with Fort Mitchell National Cemetery.

You have done a great job with WAA every year. Your love for our Veterans, coupled with your generosity and selflessness, have caused you to grow from being responsible for ensuring Fort Mitchell received 145 wreaths in 2018 to ensuring Fort Mitchell received 537 wreaths last year. Already this year, you have sponsored enough wreaths to ensure Fort Mitchell will receive 378 wreaths this year.

Wreaths cost the same this year as they did last year: only \$15 for one; \$30 for two; \$75 for five, etc., and for every two wreaths you sponsor, WAA will provide a third wreath free to Fort Mitchell. *Wreath orders due by noon Monday, November 21st*.
