Somewhere, there are single parents, or just single folk or a child or a young person for whom "alone" is an addressit's where they *live*...not just what they *are*. There are

terminally ill patients who are bound by the chains of fear and a sense of hopelessness. Keep the Faith but Share the Gospel,


