A message from our Youth Minister Daniel Cook

The early church was experiencing growth like never before. In the book of Acts we see the church growing by thousands of people in one day. I could imagine the excitement to see this many people come to faith in Christ at one time. I could also imagine the panic that took place in the church leaders as they considered how to take care of so many people all at once. What we see in the following verses is how the church was able to do such a great task.

Acts 2:42 They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and to fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer. 43 Everyone was filled with awe at the many wonders and signs performed by the apostles. 44 All the believers were together and had everything in common. 45 They sold property and possessions to give to anyone who had need. 46 Every day they continued to meet together in the temple courts. They broke bread in their homes and ate together with glad and sincere hearts, 47 praising God and enjoying the favor of all the people. And the Lord added to their number daily those who were being saved.

There are a few things that stand out to me in these verses. They took it upon themselves to meet the needs of other believers, continued to meet together at church, and broke bread together in their homes. I see it this way: they showed up consistently each day, looked out for the needs of others, worshiped and fellowshipped together, and were happy to do so. What was the result? The Lord added to the number daily those who were being saved.

God is blessing the youth group with students who haven't come in some time but also new students from our area. As God sends students our way, it is our responsibility to care for them but also teach them how to be the church. Since they are teenagers, some of this responsibility falls on us parents and the church. We have to lead by example and with expectations for our students to be involved in a true community. As a church and as parents we also must help provide resources and opportunities for this type of community to take place.

It is my prayer that every student experiences this type of community when they come to worship services. It will take parents setting the example of how to be the church, it takes the church opening our doors on campus and off campus to teenagers, and it will take the teenagers committing to show up consistently. I am excited about the opportunities that lie before us and together, with God's guidance, we can set an example of what the church is to look like for the next generation.

Angel Tree is a program of Prison Fellowship that serves incarcerated parents by providing a pathway for strengthening and restoring their relationships with their children and families. Angel Tree is a unique program that gives Epworth an opportunity to share Christ's love with families of prisoners. The program connects parents in prison with their children through the delivery of Christmas gifts given on the parent's behalf.

When a mother or father is in prison, the pain of separation from their child can be acute, but an Angel Tree gift, delivered in the parent's name, can help restore and strengthen the relationship and act as a symbol of God's love. Epworth has been participating in the Angel Tree Program for over twenty years. Many children, their families and prisoner parent have been blessed by this program.

Epworth will be participating with the Angel Tree program again this year. We will not be asking you to sponsor a specific child, buy and wrap presents and deliver to the church. Several options were given from Prison Fellowship Ministries and it has been decided that we will provide gift cards to each child. We are asking for donations so that we can provide a \$35.00 gift card to each child on behalf of their incarcerated parent. 

WREATH ACROSS AMERICA (WAA)

- Wreaths Across America Day, which is Saturday, December 16, 2023, is approaching fast.
- As you know, Wreaths Across America Day is the day we honor both our living and fallen Veterans by sponsoring wreaths thru WAA and placing them on the gravesites of Veterans interred at Fort Mitchell National Cemetery, Fort Benning Cemetery, and other local cemeteries.
- You have done a great job with WAA every year.

Your love for our Veterans, your generosity, and selflessness have caused you to grow from ensuring Fort Mitchell received 145 wreaths in 2018 to 776 wreaths last year. Already this year, you have sponsored enough wreaths to ensure Fort Mitchell will receive 477 wreaths.

- We need to sponsor approximately 200 more wreaths to surpass the record we set last year. Please help us do that to honor our Veterans even more this year.
- Wreaths cost the same this year as they did last year: only \$15 for one; \$30 for two; \$75 for five, etc., and for every two wreaths you sponsor, WAA will provide a third wreath free to Fort Mitchell.
