What is Love?

What is love? That seems to be an appropriate question to ask, with Valentine's Day being just around the corner.

Since the beginning of time, it seems, people have sought to answer that complex but captivating question. So, what is love? The question is made even more complex when we recognize that there is more than one variety or "shade" of love. For example, there is erotic love, which might tend to be more self-serving. Then there is a measure of love more like friendship, which leads us to call Philadelphia, for example, the "City of Brotherly Love."

However, the question becomes simpler when we limit our question to understanding the meaning of agape love, or the self-giving, self-sacrificing degree of love that Jesus Christ demonstrated in His ministry and in His death on the cross. Christian love—agape love—is well described in the 13th chapter of Paul's first letter to the Corinthians, commonly called "the love chapter" of the Bible. In writing to the Corinthian church, Paul says:

Love is patient

Love is kind

Love is not jealous or boastful

Love is not arrogant

Love is not rude

Love does not insist on its own way

Love is not irritable

Love is not resentful

Love does not rejoice at the wrong, but love rejoices in the right.

It seems a very convicting but useful exercise to examine ourselves and our relationships to other people and to God, in the light of agape love, by inserting our own name into that passage of scripture at every place where the word love appears. For example, can I say I am patient with other people? Am I kind to other people? Am I jealous or boastful? Am I arrogant or rude in dealing with others? Do I always insist on my own way? Am I irritable or resentful in relating to others, even those closest to me? Do I rejoice in the wrong when someone makes a mistake, or do I rejoice along with them when they succeed in doing something right?

Here's a plan. Will you covenant with me to earnestly strive to personify the attributes of agape love (mentioned above) on this

In last month's Newsletter, we thanked you for doing your finest job ever in Wreaths Across America (WAA) and told you we would update you this month on WAA Day. Here is that update and some information about 2024.

WAA Day, 16 December 2023, went great. Fort Mitchell National Cemetery (FMNC) had enough wreaths to cover every grave site in the cemetery. It looked magnificent. Your Epworth team drove two shuttle buses, placed 68 wreaths on the gravesites of your specific Veterans, helped place other wreaths on grave sites across FMNC, and Pastor Grant gave the closing prayer. It was a splendid day and an amazing honor to our Veterans. Thank you again.

We're already off to a terrific start in 2024. Epworth worshippers took great advantage of WAA's Special Deal. Epworth sent WAA \$4,981 for wreaths, which is enough to ensure FMNC will receive 732 wreaths this year.

The Special Deal ended January 16th, but WAA will still give us one free wreath for FMNC for every two wreaths we sponsor for \$17 each from now thru the cutoff date in late November 2024.

Let's continue to sponsor wreaths thru WAA to honor our Veterans and surpass the great record of 945 wreaths we achieved in 2023.
