## "An Encouraging Word"

"Oh give me a home, where the buffalo roam,

And the deer and the antelope play.

Where seldom is heard, a discouraging word,

And the skies are not cloudy all day."

"Where seldom is heard, a discouraging word." What a pleasant thought! What a difference it would make in our home, in our churches, in our daily comings and goings, on the job, and in our hearts, attitudes, and our outlook on life in general if "seldom (was) heard, a discouraging word!"

The Bible tells us, in Ephesians 4:29, which states: "Don't use foul or abusive language. Let everything you say be good and helpful, so that your words will be an encouragement to those who hear them."

I've always thought it quite a testimony to the ministry and the memory of the Apostle

Joseph that he was known by the nickname of Barnabas, which means the "Son of Encouragement" (Acts 4:36).

Have you ever met people

whose response to others and their outlook on life in general left you with the impression that they had been born into the crabapple family, so to speak? I have! But then. have we ever stopped to think if perhaps there were circumstances going on in that person's life that caused him or her to react the way they do? Perhaps a kind or encouraging word is all that's needed to relieve a person of a burden they've been carrying around, all alone, for some time! Listen again to what God says to us in the Bible: "Let everything you say be good and helpful, so that your words will be an encouragement to those who hear

them" (Ephesians 4:29, NLT). And besides, we all respond much better to positive comments than to negative criticism. A noble goal for all of us would be to make three, or five, or ten or more positive comments to another person before making the first negative comment. Husbands, wives, children, co-workers, bosses, employees, neighbors, friends, church members, pastors, boyfriends,

girlfriends, even pets, like to

be encouraged on a regular basis. An encouraging word is often the difference between having a good day and having a bad day for many people. Try it today! Build someone up with a positive, cheerful, and encouraging comment! Who knows?

Your comment may be the main reason someone's skies were "not cloudy all day."



## A message from our Youth Minister Daniel Cook

## Time to tend the garden

Spring is officially here and with spring comes: more sunshine, weather for cookouts and outdoor activities, and baseball season. Go Braves! This time of year many will begin the task of growing a garden in their backyard. My family is not known to have green thumbs as we once had a cactus die at our house. How does one do that you may ask? I am not sure, but we were able to succeed at killing a cactus. From the little I know about gardening I do know it takes a lot of work to reap the benefits of a garden.

Gardening requires maintenance: ground preparation, planting, watering, fertilizing, mulching, and yes, pulling weeds. Gardening also takes time and often takes months before the plants grow and produce. It takes a lot of passion, dedication, and patience to take a piece of ground from a plot of dirt to a garden that has life and produces plants. There are many correlations between our personal lives and growing a garden.

In John 15 we see that once we are grafted into the vine of God, which is through Jesus Christ, we will bear much fruit. In Galatians 5 Paul states, "that the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control." For that fruit to be present in our life takes work sometimes. Surrendering our life to God and allowing Jesus to be the Lord and Saviour of our life is the planting of the seed. As we tend to the garden of our soul daily, we are allowing opportunities for that fruit to grow in our lives and soon be harvested.

We must not neglect the daily work or soon the ground could become overtaken by weeds and dry dirt. Wayne Grudem says, "Perhaps a great help in keeping your heart is just the old-fashioned disciplines" of the Christian life: Bible reading, private and corporate prayer, worship, obedience to God's word, caring for the needs of others, sharing Christ with others, giving to the Lord's work, fellowship with God's people." Just as a farmer tends to his garden daily, we must tend to our hearts daily. If we do not, we run the risk of sins choking out the fruit God wants to grow in our lives.

There is no shortcut to gardening, just as there are no shortcuts in our walk with Christ. There may be days that you are tending to your heart through the disciplines mentioned above and you wonder if it is making a difference. Just remember, the most important time of growth for a plant is what happens under the soil - the fruit is just the reward. In your life, the most important part of what God is doing in your life happens where no one else can see it, in your heart. The fruit that others see is the reward after the prayer, reading, and knocking on heaven's door day after day. Keep watering, keep weeding, and keep fertilizing because the time of harvest will come!
