Have you ever felt like no matter how hard you try, you *just* can't stay out of trouble. We've probably all heard it said of <u>some</u> people (not <u>us</u>, of course!) that, "Trouble is his or her—middle name!" Jesus even taught us to pray by saying, "And lead us not into temptation, but deliver **us** from evil." (Matthew 6:13, KJV) Maybe you can relate to the following story, told only as a child could.

Our teacher asked what my favorite animal was. and I said 'Fried chicken.' She said I wasn't funny, but she couldn't have been right, because everyone else laughed. My parents told me to always tell the truth. I did. Fried chicken is my favorite animal. I told my dad what happened, and he said my teacher was probably a *member of an organization* that loves animals very much. *I do, too. Especially chicken,* pork and beef. Anyway, my teacher sent me to the principal's office. I told him what happened, and he laughed, too. Then he told me not to do it again.

I don't understand. My parents taught me to be honest, but my teacher doesn't like it when I am. Today, my teacher asked me to tell her what famous person I admired most.

I told her, "Colonel Sanders." Guess where I am now...

If we're totally honest, we've probably all shared that child's sentiments. Often, we have found it difficult to "stop sinning and start doing right," as we're told in Psalm 37:27 (CEV). But the Bible, which is God's written word, provides us with the following advice that can ensure success in our endeavor, if we sincerely desire to live a life above reproach, and one that is morally consistent with His will, His word, and His way for us. He simply says to us in

1 Thessalonians 5:22 (KJV), "Abstain from all appearance of evil." The New Living Translation of the Holy Bible makes that admonition even clearer: "Keep away from everything that even <u>looks</u> like sin."

To put it in words that even I can understand, when I was growing up the old folks often shared with me this sage advice: "An ounce of prevention is worth a pound of cure!" I've learned—often the hard way, they were right, and that you can't improve on the Word of God!

Keep your hand in Jesus' hand and your eyes on the Cross!

A message from our Youth Minister Daniel Cook

In Matthew 14:22-33 we find a story most of us know, Peter walking on water. To jog your memory the story comes after Jesus and the disciples fed over 5,000 people with five loaves of bread and two fish. After this miracle, Jesus sent the disciples ahead in a boat as He went to pray. During the night, the disciples' boat was battered by waves, and they were struggling against the wind. In the early morning hours, Jesus came to them, walking on the water. Seeing him, the disciples were frightened, thinking they were seeing a ghost.

Jesus speaks out and tells the disciples, "Take courage! It is I. Don't be afraid." Peter said, "Lord, if it's you, tell me to come to you on the water." Jesus invited Peter to come, and Peter stepped out of the boat and began walking on the water toward Jesus. As Peter stepped out of the boat things were going well until he began to look at the wind and the waves and began to sink. He then cried out for help and Jesus picked him up.

Many times when I hear that passage taught Peter comes up as the one who failed, the one who had little faith. I tend to look at this passage in a different light. Everyone in that boat could have asked Jesus to call them out in the water but only Peter did. Did the disciples who stayed in the boat think it was a ghost and choose not to go near it, did they lack faith that they could do as Jesus did and walk on water, or was the boat the safer option than getting out in the storm?

How many times in your life have you stayed in the boat instead of stepping out into the places God is calling you? John Ortberg wrote a book titled, "If you want to walk on water you have to get out of the boat." He stated, "You will never experience the miracles God has in store for you if you stay within the safety of the boat." Oftentimes we miss out on what God has for us because we cling too tightly to our comfort.

Yes Peter struggled and some may say failed, I see that Peter is the only person other than Jesus who walked on water. When Peter stepped out of the boat he began walking towards Jesus. As you read this, what is God calling you to? What miracle is waiting for you that begins with a step out of your boat and into the journey with Jesus? Get out of the boat! Go with Jesus!

Angel Tree is a program of Prison Fellowship that serves incarcerated parents by providing a pathway for strengthening and restoring their relationships with their children and families. Angel Tree is a unique program that gives Epworth an opportunity to share Christ's love with families of prisoners. The program connects parents in prison with their children through the delivery of Christmas gifts given on the parent's behalf.

When a mother or father is in prison, the pain of separation from their child can be acute, but an Angel Tree gift, delivered in the parent's name, can help restore and strengthen the relationship and act as a symbol of God's love. Epworth has been participating in the Angel Tree Program for over twenty years. Many children, their families and prisoner parent have been blessed by this program.

Epworth will be participating with the Angel Tree program again this year. We will not be asking you to sponsor a specific child, buy and wrap presents and deliver to the church. Several options were given from Prison Fellowship Ministries and it has been decided that we will provide gift cards to each child. We are asking for donations so that we can provide a \$35.00 gift card to each child on behalf of their incarcerated parent. Wreaths Across America (WAA) Day, which is Saturday, December 15, 2024. As you know, WAA Day is the day we honor both our living and fallen Veterans by sponsoring wreaths thru WAA and placing them on the gravesites of Veterans interred at Fort Mitchell National Cemetery, Fort Benning Cemetery, and other cemeteries.

You have done a great job with WAA every year. Your love for our Veterans, your generosity, and selflessness have caused you to grow from ensuring Fort Mitchell
