"Ten Steps to Being a Friendly Church"

My good friend, and fellow paster in our Global Methodist Connection, Dr. George Mathison, has been a blessing and mentor to me for more years than either of us would like to admit.

I recall an article that Dr. Mathison published several years ago in "The Village Methodist," his former church's newsletter, in which he reminded his congregation that the summer months, especially July and August, are the two months when people are most likely to relocate, moving from one home to another. Accordingly, Brother George encouraged his members to be on the lookout for moving vans in their neighborhoods and for new faces in their community, for it is during a time of transition that people will be looking for a church home where they can best make a contribution and where their needs can be met. I am also convinced that the recent advent of a new school year presents us with still other opportunities for outreach and evangelism. Brother George further instructed his good people in factors that seem to lend a "friendly church" atmosphere to people seeking a church home, citing another Methodist pastor, Dr. Don Kea. Listed below are their ten steps to being a friendly church (with some "add ons" of my own).

1. **Smile at people!** It takes 72 muscles to frown and only 14 to smile. Your smile is one of your finest assets. Use it!

- 2. **Speak to people,** even if you do not know their names. A cheerful word of greeting can often disperse the dark clouds of a bad day.
- 3. Call people by name. The sweetest music to anyone's ears is often the sound of their own name.
- 4. **Be friendly and helpful.** Lend a hand and look for ways to help someone, especially those who "look lost." If you want friends, then be a friend.
- 5. **Be cordial**. Speak and act as if every thing you do for others is a genuine pleasure. Try to look happy and you may very well be happy.
- 6. Be genuinely interested in people. Try not to limit yourself to a few friends when there are so many likeable people around you. Try to make people feel as though they are the most important person in the world as they are speaking with you.

- 7. Be generous with praise, cautious with criticism. Try to follow the adage: "Praise in public, chastise in private."
- 8. Be considerate of the feelings of others. Often there are three sides to a controversy...yours, the other person's, and the right one.
- 9. **Be alert to give service** (back to number 4 above). It's been said that the true mark of success in life is not measured by the number of people who serve you, but rather by the number of people you serve.
- 10. Add to all the above a good sense of humor. "A merry heart doeth good like a medicine." (Proverbs 17:22)

Hello everyone!

Albert Einstein once said, "Time flies when you are having fun." This quote has been true for my family over the past year since I started serving as the Youth Pastor. In ministry, if you can find people you enjoy being around, who love Jesus, and have a heart for people, you set yourself up for success. The youth ministry has seen success over the past year because of the people at Epworth, their love for the Lord, and their passion for the next generation.

Here is a quick look at where we have been and where we are going:

This past summer we had a great time getting to know each other better, as well as growing in our relationship with Christ. At youth camp, this group took huge steps of faith as individuals and as a group in worship, prayer, and new depths in their relationship with Christ. Epworth Students had nine students come forward for baptism last month.

The youth ministry has seen growth numerically over the past year. We hosted our first-ever Fall Brawl and saw many visitors, and many of them became regular attendees. We went on our first ski trip and took 24 students to experience something that many of them never experienced before. The youth Sunday school class also saw growth. Some weeks we have 15 - 20 in attendance.

The true stars of the ministry are the exceptional leaders who come week after week to minister to these students. We have seen growth numerically with the leaders and God continues to send the right people to help the ministry continue to grow. We have a good mix of personalities, ages, and giftings that make it possible to reach different teenagers. Without these leaders, it would be impossible to do all the things you see happening in the youth ministry.

As thankful as we are for all God has done this past year we believe there are greater things ahead. In August we started separating Jr. High and Sr. High students on Wednesday nights. This will help us provide age-targeted lessons, small groups, and conversations to each group. This will help the students connect better with their peers and leaders. This will also help the younger students transition better into the youth ministry.

We are getting ready to start back our breakfast devotions for students again after seeing much success with these last year. This upcoming year we will return to Winterplace, West Virginia for another year of skiing. We are jumping back into the Fall Brawl this month. We know we will attend Merge Youth Camp again next summer and are looking to add a mission trip as well.

I am grateful to be a part of this church and to be able to lead the student ministry. I am thankful for the adults who I am able to serve alongside week after week to reach the next generation. Most of all I give all praise, glory, and honor to God for the many ways we have seen Him move in and through this group this past year. I am excited to see what this next year holds for Epworth Students and Epworth Church.

Sunday Mornings Worship



WREATHS ACROSS AMERICA (WAA)

- Wreaths Across America (WAA) Day, which is Saturday, December 14, 2024, is approaching.
- As you know, WAA Day is the day we honor both our living and fallen Veterans by sponsoring wreaths thru WAA and placing them on the gravesites of Veterans interred at Fort Mitchell National Cemetery, Fort Benning Cemetery, and other cemeteries.
- You have done a great job with WAA every year. Your love for our Veterans, your generosity, and selflessness have caused you to grow from ensuring Fort Mitchell received 145 wreaths in 2018 to 945 wreaths last year. Already this year, you have sponsored enough wreaths to ensure Fort Mitchell will receive 732 wreaths.
- We need to sponsor approximately 140 more wreaths between now and Thanksgiving to surpass the record we set last year. Please help us do that to honor our Veterans even more this year.
- Wreaths cost \$17 for one; \$34 for two; \$85 for five, etc., and for every two wreaths you sponsor, WAA will provide a third wreath free to Fort Mitchell.
