## Christmas—The Season of Giving by Rev. Grant Parker

Christmas is known as a season of giving. Millions of gifts costing billions of dollars will be exchanged between now and December 25. It's so easy to lose sight of the real meaning of Christmas amid the hustle and bustle of the season's commercial frenzy.

Hopefully, though, we'll not forget the greatest gift ever given. The apostle John reminds us, "For God so loved the world, that He <u>gave</u> His only begotten Son, that whosoever believes in Him should not perish, but have eternal life." (John 3:16) God offered a gift to each of us when He gave His Son on that very first Christmas Day over 2,000 years ago.

Suppose we were expected to exchange gifts with God. Well, obviously none of us could match God's priceless gift of Jesus. But what would you give to God if you were to exchange Christmas gifts with Him this year? Gold? Frankincense? Myrrh? In one of my favorite Christmas hymns, "In the Bleak Midwinter," Christina Rossetti proposes an excellent answer to that question:

What can I give Him poor as I am?

If I were a shepherd, I would bring a lamb;

If I were a Wise Man, I would do my part;

Yet what I can, I give Him: give (Him) my heart.

This Christmas season—and in the New Year—let me encourage you to give all that you know of yourselves, to all that you know of Him! What would be the result if we truly gave <u>all</u> of ourselves—our actions, attitudes, assets, gifts, time, tongues, talents, effort, energy, relationships, families, friendships, souls, bodies, service—our <u>everything</u> to Jesus?

For most of us, what I'm proposing is a radical change in the way we function and in the way we relate to others. But these are radical times, and only those who are radically saved and radically <u>changed</u> by a personal—not just a "passing"— relationship with Jesus Christ, will make a positive impact in the world for His sake.

What I'm proposing means that Sunday is considered the Lord's Day once again, and all the lame excuses in the world won't change the fact that we should be in the worship service and in Sunday School (as a family) when we're not! I'm suggesting that fathers should become the spiritual heads of their households, and that their wives and children have every right to see God's light and love reflected in the actions of their husbands and fathers! I'm suggesting that wives and all women should strive more diligently to become who the whole Church is really meant to be-the faithful Bride of Christ! I'm proposing that we read and study the Bible daily, and practice its precepts. What I'm proposing is that we will commit ourselves to Paul's clear mandate to the Roman church (12:1-2): "I urge you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies a living and holy sacrifice, acceptable to God, which is your spiritual service of worship. And do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, that you may prove what the will of God is, that which is good and acceptable and perfect!" In other words, I'm proposing that if we are saved by Jesus Christ, then let's act like it! If we're Christians, then let's determine to live

according to biblical Christian principles of morality! God has called the church to *affect* the world in a positive way. But instead, I fear we've allowed the world to infect the church. What I'm proposing is that we seek after holiness, without which no man shall see the Lord (Hebrews 12:14). I'm proposing that we become a tithing church in A.D. 2025. The Bible says that the first 10% of our income belongs to God-not to the mortgage company, the bank, the bar, a retail store, a car dealership, the government, or to anyone else. What I'm proposing is for the families of our congregation to have family devotions daily in 2025. What I'm proposing is that each of us will commit ourselves to winning lost souls to Christ, witnessing for Jesus, and inviting people to church and Sunday School, and our weekly Epworth Bible Studies in 2025.

I know that what I'm proposing as our gift to God seems radical to many. Some may have already put my article aside. But please understand, what I have proposed to you is simply visible fruit (outer evidence) of a relationship Jesus described to Nicodemus in John 3:7, "Do not marvel that I said to you, 'You must be born again!"

"What shall I give Him, poor as I am? What I can I give Him, give (Him) my heart." May we become gifts to God this Christmas!!



## Angel Tree

Angel Tree is a program of Prison Fellowship that serves incarcerated parents by providing a pathway for strengthening and restoring their relationships with their children and families. Angel Tree is a unique program that gives Epworth an opportunity to share Christ's love with families of prisoners. The program connects parents in prison with their children through the delivery of Christmas gifts given on the parent's behalf.

When a mother or father is in prison, the pain of separation from their child can be acute, but an Angel Tree gift, delivered in the parent's name, can help restore and strengthen the relationship and act as a symbol of God's love. Epworth has been participating in the Angel Tree Program for over twenty years. Many children, their families and prisoner parent have been blessed by this program.

Epworth will be participating with the Angel Tree program again this year. We will not be asking you to sponsor a specific child, buy and wrap presents and deliver to the church. Several options were given from Prison Fellowship Ministries and it has been decided that we will provide gift cards to each child. We are asking for donations so that we can provide a \$40.00 gift card to each child on behalf of their incarcerated parent. We feel this is the safest way to be able to carry on this worthwhile program.

You have always been a very generous and loving church and I look forward to us being a part of Angel Tree again this year and praying for those we serve.


