"Doing a New Thing in the New Year!"

"This is what the Lord says... 'See, I am doing a new thing!'" Isaiah 43:14, 19 (NIV)

Even though the church's new year actually begins with the first Sunday of Advent, New Year's Day (January 1) still has a significant influence on our lives. We often seem to get caught up in the business of making resolutions, which are as much a part of New Year's Day as eating black-eyed peas and hog jowls. Of course, the problem with New Year's resolutions is that many are broken even before February arrives. Perhaps one reason we fail to keep resolutions is because we determine to keep them through our own power alone! What a difference it makes when it is the power of God Almighty that is "doing a new thing" in us!

I suffered through and survived the basic course in accounting, "Elementary Accounting," while I was a sophomore in college. I learned two things from taking "Elementary Accounting": #1 – that I was not cut out to be an accountant, and #2 – many accounts need to be "closed out" at the end of each year.

We would be greatly blessed if we were to apply that same basic accounting principle to our lives at the start of each new year, wouldn't we? We all have accounts needing to be "closed out," so to speak.

The account of past sins is one such area we need to "close out." Proverbs 28:13 says, "He who conceals his sins does not prosper, but whoever confesses and renounces them finds mercy." King David was a party to adultery and an accomplice to murder. He thought no one was aware of his sins. But God knew of David's sin and sent a prophet (Nathan) to tell the king so. David knew that if he confessed his sin and was truly repentant, God would forgive him. David's confession is recorded in Psalm 51:1-4 and 13-17. The Bible tells us, we have "all sinned and come short of the glory of God." (Romans 3:23) Therefore, past sin is an area we need to address in the name of the one Who "breaks the power of canceled sin," as the words of a well-known hymn remind us ("O For a Thousand Tongues to Sing"). Sin is an account we need to "close out." The Word of God says, "If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness." (1 John 1:9)

Hard feelings (grudges, bitterness, hurt feelings, etc.) is another account we may need to "close out." When Jesus was

instructing His disciples to pray, He taught them to say "forgive us our debts, as we forgive our debtors." Holding on to hurt feelings and bearing grudges always hurts the one who harbors the hard feelings more than the offender. "Acid does as much damage to the vessel that holds it, as it does to the surface it's poured on!" Ask God to help you forgive others, as He has forgiven you!

Close the book on negative thoughts in A.D. 2024. Remember the old adage, "can't never could!" Don't let disappointments, setbacks, sour attitudes and unwarranted criticism squelch what God can do for you, in you, and through you this year. Claim Philippians 4:13, "I can do all things through Christ Who strengthens me!" Believe, with all your might, that God means it when His word says, "We are more than conquerors through Him Who loved us." (Romans 8:37)

Remember—"If anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; the old has gone, the new has come!" (2 Corinthians 5:17) May God bless you, and may His Holy Spirit do "a new thing" in you throughout the new year.
